Welcoming Our New Neighbors

This year, we hoped to sponsor an Angel Tree to support children and families during the Christmas season. We felt this was especially important in light of Hurricane Helene's devastating impact on our community. However, God had a different plan. Every school and community organization we contacted for this initiative has been blessed with an abundance of volunteers stepping forward to meet the needs of those they serve.

After hearing from Joyce Endaya, Outreach Coordinator for Lutheran Services Carolinas' New Americans Program, we were led to reflect on the many Bible verses calling us to welcome and care for refugees. Joyce reminded us of Matthew 25:35: "I was a stranger, and you welcomed me." Her message helped us see how God is calling us to care for those who have traveled from around the world to join our community.

Joyce shared about her organization's work with the U.S. government to resettle refugees—individuals who have waited years for the chance to come to the United States. Often, these individuals have less than 24 hours' notice before boarding a plane to begin their new lives here. When they arrive, they have little more than the clothes on their backs. Lutheran Services helps them find housing, secure jobs, and become independent as quickly as possible.

This is where *Weaverville United Methodist Church* can make a difference. Refugees arriving in Western North Carolina—primarily from Afghanistan, Ukraine, and countries like El Salvador—need basic household items. One critical item is a vacuum cleaner.

Joyce shared the story of an Afghan refugee who arrived just one day before Hurricane Helene struck. That same night, her apartment flooded. Alone in a new country, she texted for help, terrified that she might drown. With the aid of a neighbor, she made it to the roof and waited for rescue. This story underscores why a phone and phone cards are essential for new arrivals, along with other basic necessities. This year, WUMC will partner with Lutheran Services to support these families and individuals. We are collecting *new bagless vacuum cleaners* (suitable for both carpet and hardwood) and *Walmart gift cards* in denominations of \$25 or \$50. Gift cards will help refugees purchase essentials and pay for phone cards, enabling them to stay connected and safe.

If you prefer, you can write a check to the church, noting "Refugee Program - Walmart Gift Card" in the memo line. Please bring all items to the church by *Sunday*, *December 22*. For more information, please contact Renee Weaver .grohweaver@aol.com.

Together, let us embody the love of Christ and extend a warm welcome to those seeking refuge among us.

Every Monday, at 7pm in the smaller meeting room. The entire Weaverville community and beyond is invited to gather in prayer.




Each Wednesday morning from 8am-9am in the Education Building, or join us in spirit.

The class meets every Sunday in the Education Building, main floor at 10 am. The current study is "*Encounters with Jesus*" by Timothy Keller




